

Dr. Prerana Roy teaches history at Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, under Delhi University. Her PhD at the Centre for Historical Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, was on 'Marriage, Family and kinship in North India (c.1500 BCE – 4th century CE). Her research interests include early Indian perspectives on gender, family, households, and kinship patterns in early Indian social history. Her publications include '*Kanyādāna* in the Brahmanical Literature', and 'Daughters, Brides and Wives: The Institution of Marriage in the Early Vedic Literature', (both in Proceedings of the Indian History Congress, 2017 and 2018). Her paper 'Women and the Household in the Shadows of Marriage: the Ṛg Veda and Avestan Traditions', presented won the Dr. Nasreen Ahmad Memorial Prize, at the 82nd session of the Indian History Congress, (Kakatiya University, Warangal). Apart from that, she is a regular contributor to the IIC Diary of the India International Centre, New Delhi, featuring themes pertaining to history, art, religion and culture.
